


Lafayette Parish Candidate Responses on Library Censorship

The following report was compiled by Lafayette Citizens Against Censorship (LCAC) in September of 2023 to help educate voters on the serious issues regarding censorship and book banning in Lafayette Parish. This information is based upon the candidates' responses to LCAC's survey. All survey questions are included below.






The charter for the board is to focus on the budget, not to become mired in the day to day of the library and I feel the above reflects those qualities.


9. Do you think the library Board of Control should make decisions regarding day-to-day operation of the public library, including programming and collection development?



If at all possible, I think they should be apolitical, hold no political biases, willing to serve with an open mind and no preconceived judgement.








9. Do you think the library Board of Control should make decisions regarding day-to-day operation of the public library, including programming and collection development?


